SECTION III A

BILL NO. 2020-14 ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND RATIFYING CERTAIN ACTIONS TAKEN BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF BELTON, MISSOURI PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE V OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, OF THE CITY OF BELTON; AMENDING SECTION 2-926 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY MANAGER TO TAKE NECESSARY ACTIONS.

WHEREAS, the spread of a novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has necessitated the President of the United States of America, the Governor of the State of Missouri, and the Mayor of the City of Belton, Missouri to declare a state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Center for Disease Control has issued certain guidance to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, including taking actions such as social distancing; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the Mayor issued a Proclamation Declaring a Local Emergency and corresponding Order that, in part, declared a state of emergency in the City of Belton, Missouri and ordered residents and businesses to take certain actions to mitigate the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-1040 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Belton, Missouri requires that the Mayor call a meeting of the City Council as soon as possible after the declaration of a state of emergency or disaster to provide the City Council the opportunity to approve and ratify the actions of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to protect the life, health, and safety of Belton residents and to ensure the continued operations of the City during this state of emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby approves and ratifies the actions of the Mayor of the City of Belton in issuing the Proclamation of Declaration of Local Emergency and accompanying Order both dated March 17, 2020.
- Section 2. That Section 2-929 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Belton is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following:

Sec. 2-929 - Purchasing and contracting during declared state of emergency.

During a state of emergency as declared by the President of the United States of America, the Governor of the State of Missouri, or the Mayor, the City Manager or his or her designee is authorized to make purchases and enter into contracts necessary to ensure the continued operations of the city and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the city.

Section 3.	The Mayor, City Manager, Police Chief/Director of Emergency Management and other officials of the City are hereby authorized to take any and all actions necessary to carry out purpose of this Ordinance, to ensure the continued operations of the City, and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Belton residents.

Proclamation Declaring a State of Local Emergency in the City of Belton, Missouri

WHEREAS, Chapter 2, article V of the Code of Ordinances, City of Belton, Missouri, Article IV of Charter of the City of Belton, Missouri, and applicable Missouri law grants the Mayor, the authority to proclaim and declare a state of emergency or disaster when the Mayor determines that their exists an emergency or disaster is imminent;

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention activated its Emergency Operations Center to better provide ongoing support to the COVID-19 response on January 21, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19 on January 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the WHO declared COVID-19 a global pandemic;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national state of emergency due to the spread of COVID-19 in the United States of America;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Governor of the State of Missouri declared a state of emergency and invocated the provisions of Sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo, to ensure the protection of the safety and welfare of the citizens of Missouri;

WHEREAS, the continued spread of COVID-19 constitutes and presents an imminent threat of widespread illness, which requires emergency action;

WHEREAS, the proclamation of a state of emergency provides the City the ability to take measures to reduce the possibility of exposure to disease, control the risk, and promote the health and safety of Belton residents; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to employ all means available under the law to protect public life, health, safety and property to limit the development, contraction and spread of COVID-19 creating this emergency;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF BELTON, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

THAT a State of Emergency exists in the City of Belton, Missouri, beginning at 12:00 a.m. on Wednesday, March 18, 2020 and lasting until such as time as the Mayor of the City of Belton, Missouri determines otherwise.

FURTHER, THAT, in addition to all other powers granted by the Charter, Code of Ordinances, or applicable Missouri law, the Mayor is authorized, to take the following actions to protect life and property:

- (1) To appropriate and expend funds, make contracts, obtain and distribute equipment, materials, and supplies for emergency management purposes;
- (2) To provide for the health and safety of persons, including emergency assistance to victims of any disaster;
- (3) To provide for the safety of property;
- (4) To direct and coordinate the development of disaster plans and programs in accordance with the policies and plans of federal and state disaster and emergency planning, including any natural or other type of disaster;
- (5) To appoint, provide, or remove rescue teams, auxiliary fire and police personnel and other emergency operations teams, units or personnel who may serve without compensation; and
- (6) In the event of disaster, to waive the provisions of statutes requiring advertisements for bids for the performance of public work or entering into contracts.

ORDER

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, a Proclamation Declaring a State of Local Emergency was issued to authorize the City of Belton, Missouri to take necessary measures to reduce the possibility of exposure to COVID-19 and to promote the health, safety, and welfare of Belton residents;

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020 the Cass County Health Department Director issued a Public Health Emergency Order declaring the COVID-19 pandemic a public health emergency in Cass County and ordering businesses and residents of Cass County to take certain actions to reduce the possibility of exposure to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Center of Disease Control has issued certain guidance regarding steps and actions necessary to reduce the possibility of exposure to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Code of Ordinances, City of Belton, the City Charter of the City of Belton, and applicable Missouri law authorize the Mayor to, under certain circumstances, take certain steps to provide for the health and safety of persons; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Proclamation Declaring a State of Local Emergency, the Code of Ordinances, City Charter, and applicable Missouri law the Mayor desires to take all necessary action to protect Belton residents from the spread of COVID-19.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS SO ORDERED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF BELTON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. For the purposes of this Order, the term "Public Gathering" means any gathering of 10 or more people at any restaurant, tavern, professional, social, cultural, entertainment, or other special event where people are not separated by physical space of at least six feet. The term "Public Gathering" shall not include retail outlets, including grocery stores and or pharmacies, as long as the same continue operations with appropriate social distancing precautions and adhere to applicable Center of Disease Control guidelines.

Section 2. In order to reduce the possibility of exposure to COVID-19, a severe, novel coronavirus that lacks a vaccine or antiviral treatment options, all Public Gatherings are prohibited from taking place in the City of Belton, Missouri during the duration of the Proclamation Declaring a State of Local Emergency dated March 17, 2020, unless such Public Gathering can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Police Chief/Director of Emergency Management that sufficient mitigation plans for infectious disease are in place.

Section 3. That the City Manager and Police Chief/Director of Emergency Management are directed to immediately make and adopt rules and regulations for the evaluation of approval of sufficient mitigation plans for infectious disease for Public Gatherings.

BILL NO. 2020-15 ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2020-4558 TO DEFER WATER AND SEWER RATES EFFECTIVE DATE TO JUNE 1, 2020.

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020, the City Council passed Ordinance No. 2020-4558 (the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, following the passage of the Ordinance the spread of COVID-19 necessitated the President of the United States of America, the Governor of the State of Missouri, and the Mayor of the City of Belton, Missouri to declare states of emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to delay the imposition of the Ordinance until such time as the spread of COVID-19 does not present a local health emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELTON, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Section 7 of Ordinance No. 2020-06 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from June 1, 2020.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission is authorized pursuant to Section 36-35 of the Unified Development Code to review and approve, approve conditionally or disapprove final plats within a reasonable time after submission; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission convened a meeting on March 2, 2020, and reviewed and recommended approval of the final plat of Shady Lane Community Building to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that this plat meets the standards for platting as set forth in the Unified Development Code and is in the best interest of the City to approve the plat for recording.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELTON, CASS COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. That the City Council of the City of Belton hereby concurs with the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approves the Final Plat of Shady Lane Community Building attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated as if fully set forth herein.
- Section 2. The Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized to sign the plat, acknowledging that the plat meets all requirements of the Unified Development Code.
- Section 3. The plat shall be recorded at the Cass County Recorder of Deeds, and a copy kept on permanent file at the City of Belton.
- **Section 4.** The final plat shall be recorded within one year of City Council approval or the approval shall be considered null and void.
- **Section 5.** That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

ITEM FOR CONSIDERATION:

Approval of a Final Plat of Shady Lane Community Building a subdivision in the City of Belton, Cass County, Missouri

PROPOSED CITY COUNCIL MOTION:

Concur with the Planning Commission recommendation of approval.

BACKGROUND:

A Planned Unit Development (PUD) for the Shady Lane duplexes was reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission on October 21, 2019. The PUD permitted the renovation of the existing Shady Lane duplexes to an age-restricted, 55 and older, rental community. The PUD included amenities for residents such as a community center, carports, community gardens, a trail network and security gates at the main entrances to the community.

The PUD also included the vacation of the existing public streets to allow the proposed security gates. A portion of unimproved Hargis Street, east of Sunny Drive was vacated as part of this request. At this location, the applicant proposed a 2000 square foot community center. The community center includes an office, meeting room, and exercise room for residents.

This request is necessary to plat the vacated right-of-way to create a lot for the proposed community center.

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION, ACTION, AND DATE:

The Planning Commission considered the request at their meeting on March 2, 2020. The Planning Commission recommended approval of the application for a Final Plat of Shady Lane Community Building as the final plat is consistent with the final development plan. The plat meets all final plat requirements of Section 36.35 of Unified Development Code.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY'S ZONING MAP FROM C-2 (GENERAL COMMERCIAL) DISTRICT TO R-3 PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, FOR APPROXIMATELY 6.3 ACRES OF THE PARCEL LOCATED ON THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF MULLEN ROAD AND SYCAMORE DRIVE, BELTON, CASS COUNTY, MISSOURI.

WHEREAS, a request was submitted to rezone approximately 6.3 acres of the parcel located on the NE corner of Mullen Road and Sycamore Drive from C-2 (General Commercial) District to R-3 Planned Unit Development District; and

WHEREAS, under the Unified Development Code Section 20-1- Land Use Applications and Procedures provides that the City Council may, by ordinance, amend, supplement, change or modify zoning district boundaries; and

WHEREAS, notice of the public hearing was published in the Cass County Democrat on February 7, 2020; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held before the Belton Planning Commission on March 2, 2020 in accordance with the provisions of the Unified Development Code Section 20-2- Procedure for Zoning Map and Text Amendments; and

WHEREAS, the Unified Development Code Section 20-3- Findings of Fact, provides criteria for findings of fact to be used with zoning map amendments; and

WHEREAS, the Belton Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the application to the City Council by an eight to zero vote; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes it is in the best interest of the City to rezone this tract of land to R-3 Planned Unit Development District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELTON, CASS COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. That the City Council of the City of Belton hereby concurs with the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approves the rezoning of the subject property from C-2 (General Commercial) District to R-3 Planned Unit Development District.
- Section 2. That the City Planner shall take all necessary actions to supplement the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning map of the City.
- Section 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.

ISSUE/RECOMMENDATION:

An amendment to the City's Zoning Map from C-2 (General Commercial) District to R-3 Planned Unit Development District for approximately 6.3 acres of the parcel located on the NE corner of Mullen Road and Sycamore Drive.

BACKGROUND:

The Traditions Planned Unit Development (PUD) was approved in 2006. This is a 113-acre mixed-use R-3 PUD including single-family homes, multi-family units and future commercial development along the east side of Mullen Road.

On January 6, 2020, the Planning Commission approved a Final Development Plan for Phase I of the Traditions Villas. The Phase I plan is abutting the area of this rezoning application and is shown on the preliminary development plan. Phase I consisted of 36 villa units in 6 buildings.

This application was filed to rezone the existing C-2 General Commercial District along the Mullen Road frontage to a R-3 Planned Unit Development, to be consistent with the other residential areas of the Traditions PUD.

The related Preliminary Development Plan requests the approval of Phases II and III of Traditions Villas. The Preliminary Development Plan provides for 54 one-story villa units in 10 buildings. These are proposed to be two-bedroom units of approximately 868 square feet. The preliminary development plan includes a colored perspective drawing that shows architectural detail, building materials and colors.

These units are identical to those approved in the Phase I Final Development Plan.


PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION:

The Planning Commission convened a public hearing March 2, 2020. At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Planning Commission recommended approval of the rezoning from C-2 (General Commercial) District to R-3 Planned Unit Development District. The Planning Commission vote was 8 to 0 in support of the application.

BELTON, MISSOURI


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PRELIMINARY GRADING PLAN


