

Minutes of the Belton City Council
April 27, 2021

Mayor Larkey called the work session to order at 5:59 p.m. Alexa Barton, City Manager, provided the Council with an acronym overview as provided by Mid America Regional Council (MARC). (Attachment A)

Sheila Ernzen, Assistant City Manager and Finance Director, provided the Council with the monthly financial report for March 2021.

Being no further business, Mayor Larkey adjourned the work session at 6:42 p.m. and called the meeting to order.

Councilmember Lawson led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

CONSENT AGENDA

Councilmember Powell asked the Council to please remove item A from the Consent Agenda and discuss under separate action.

Councilmember Clark moved to approve the consent agenda consisting of a motion:

- **approving the sale of surplus city inventory/personal property by Mayo Auction & Realty.**
- **approving Resolution R2021-27: A resolution approving the purchase of six replacement ruggedized laptops, in the amount of \$26,837.92.**
- **approving Resolution R2021-28: A resolution approving the purchase of body cameras from Watchguard to replace the current ones that were purchased in 2015.**
- **approving Resolution R2021-29: A resolution appointing Allyson Lawson to serve as the City Council Liaison to the Public Safety Sales Tax Oversight Committee.**
- **approving Resolution R2021-30: A resolution approving a letter of engagement with Jackson Lewis P.C. for representation of the City of Belton with respect to labor relations and employment law matters.**
- **approving Resolution R2021-31: A resolution approving the purchase of a 2022 Ford F250 Crew Cab 4x4 truck, MVP3 snow blade 8'6" and a Sam salt spreader from Joe Machens Ford Lincoln, for the Park Department in the amount of \$51,897.00, and the disposal/sale of Chevy Tahoe Truck #1257 through the City's auctioneer service provider.**

Councilmember Savage seconded. All voted in favor. Consent agenda approved.

Mayor Larkey read a **Motion approving the minutes of the April 13, 2021, City Council Meeting.** Presented by Councilmember Clark, seconded by Councilmember Gough. Councilmember Powell asked how the Council can check on the status of the action items from Ordinance No. 2021-4622. Padraic Corcoran, Attorney, said this type of question is best handled during Communications from City Council at the end of the meeting. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

REGULAR AGENDA

Andrea Cunningham, City Clerk, read Bill No. 2021-24: **An ordinance approving a Final Plat for Center 301; a tract of land in the Southwest Quarter of Section 12, Township 46, Range 33, in the City of Belton, Cass County, Missouri and authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to sign the plat for recording with the Cass County Recorder's office.**

Presented by Councilmember Clark, seconded by Councilmember Trutzel. Councilmember Powell said he'd like to see the plat signed, notarized, and the name of the owner listed before it comes to the Council for final reading. He said it's the same for Bill No. 2021-24 and Bill No. 2021-25. Vote on the first reading was recorded with all voting in favor. First reading passed.

Ms. Cunningham read Bill No. 2021-25: **An ordinance approving a Final Plat Replat for Lot 8, Belton Gateway; a tract of land in the Southwest quarter of Section 12, Township 46, Range 33, in the City of Belton, Cass County, Missouri and authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to sign the plat for recording with the Cass County Recorder's office.**

Presented by Councilmember Clark, seconded by Councilmember Gough. Vote on the first reading was recorded with all voting in favor. First reading passed.

MAYOR'S COMMUNICATIONS

Councilmember Gough moved to appoint Dave Clark as Mayor Pro Tem. Councilmember Kraft seconded. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Councilmember Clark moved to appoint Rob Powell as the City Council Liaison to the Planning Commission. Councilmember Gough seconded. Councilmember Peek shared concerns about this appointment. Councilmember Clark agreed with the concerns but said it's the Mayor's duty to appoint people and he will support the Mayor's decision. Mr. Corcoran said most things the Planning Commission does ends up at the City Council for final approval. Councilmember Savage said the Planning Commission is important for guiding the City in development and he agreed with Councilmember Peek's concerns. Councilmember Powell said he promised to be fair and bring up residents' concerns. Councilmember Trutzel said he is abstaining. All voted in favor except for Councilmembers Peek and Savage who voted no and Councilmember Trutzel who abstained. Motion carried.

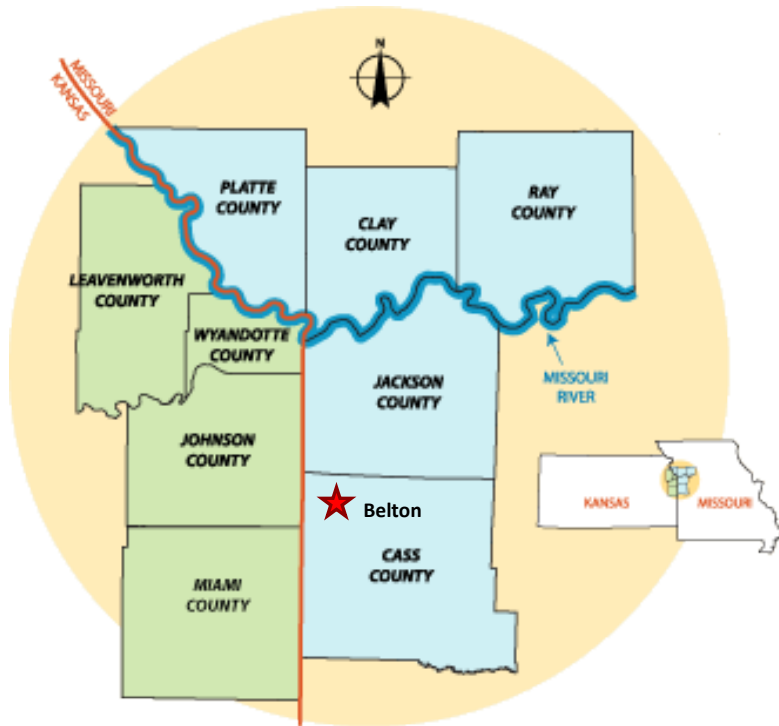

MID-AMERICA REGIONAL COUNCIL

What is the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC)?



MARC serves as both the federally designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the bistate Kansas City region and as the Council of Governments (COG) for the nine counties and 119 cities in the region. MARC is governed by a Board of Directors made up of local elected officials, and is funded by federal, state, and private grants; local contributions, and earned income. A major portion of MARC's budget is passed through to local governments and other agencies for programs and services.

As a voluntary association of local governments, MARC convenes partners and coordinates planning efforts on a wide range of issues that are important to communities in the metro, including aging services, early learning, health care, community development, homeland security, emergency services, the regional 911 system and much more.

What is a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and Council of Governments (COG)?

Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO): A Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is an agency created by federal law to provide local elected officials input into the planning and implementation of federal transportation funds.

Council of Governments (COG): is a multi-service entity with state and locally-defined boundaries that delivers a variety of federal, state, and local programs while carrying out its function as a planning organization, technical assistance provider, and “visionary” to its member local governments.

MARC BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The MARC Board of Directors consists of 33 locally elected leaders from the nine member counties and the six largest cities in the region. The member counties are Cass, Clay, Jackson, Platte, and Ray in Missouri; and Johnson, Leavenworth, Miami, and Wyandotte in Kansas.

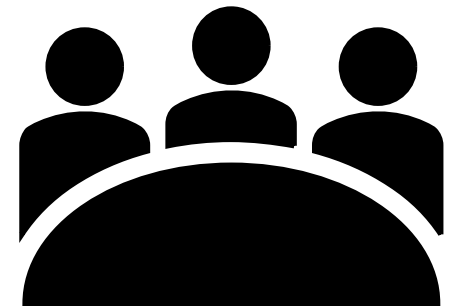
