
STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM PLAN (SWMP)

CITY OF BELTON, MO

MS4 Permit

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s), are publicly-owned conveyance or system of conveyances that discharge to waters of the United States.



- 4. Storm sewer system
- 6. Urban streams

- The City of Belton (City) is one of 162 regulated MS4s in the State of Missouri.
- The City is currently permitted under the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR) General Permit for small MS4s.
- DNR has developed a new Comprehensive MS4 Permit that the City will apply for in April 2021.

Stormwater Management Program

- The MS4 permit requires Belton to develop a Stormwater Management Program Plan, or "SWMP" that includes:
 - Measureable goals
 - Interim milestones
 - An iterative process for evaluating Best Management Practices (BMPs)
- The City's SWMP must be updated for the new Comprehensive MS4 Permit.
- ▶ The updated SWMP will be submitted to DNR in December 2021.
- ▶ The MS4 permit requires that the SWMP go through public review.
- There will be a 30-day review period for the public to submit comments.

The 6 MCMs

Every SWMP must address the following Minimum Control Measures (MCMs)

- 1. Public Education and Outreach
- 2. Public Participation
- 3. Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)
- 4. Construction Site Runoff Control
- 5. Post-Construction Runoff Control
- 6. Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping



MCM #1: Public Education and Outreach on Stormwater Impacts

- Target Audiences
- Target Pollutants
- Education and Outreach BMPs
 - ▶ Flyers, webpage, social media posts, etc.

- Involvement BMPs
 - Adopt-a-Stream Program
 - Next Clean-Up Event: March 27, 2021
- The City tracks participation levels in these programs to evaluate their growth and effectiveness.



MCM #2: Public Participation


- Public Participation
 - Public MS4 Permit Review
 - ▶ 30-day notice and public meeting
 - Public SWMP Review
 - > 30-day notice and public meeting
 - Annual City Council Update

- Public Input & Tracking
 - Submit comments, inquiries, concerns, and helpful information to the Public Works email
 - publicworkscomments@belton.org
 - Comments and reported concerns will be tracked to help improve and develop the SWMP.

MCM #3: Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)

- Requires monitoring, investigation, tracing, clean-up, and enforcement of IDDE program
- The City of Belton approved an illicit discharge ordinance in 2012.
- City Staff performs numerous inspections to monitor for illicit discharges.
 - Outfalls
 - Public Improvement Projects
 - Private Development Projects
- ▶ Illicit discharges are tracked through a computer program to identify the effectiveness of public education and enforcement of the illicit discharge ordinance.
- ▶ The IDDE program is reviewed annually and updated as needed.

MCM #4: Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control



- The City of Belton requires Land Disturbance Permits for most construction activities.
- Construction contractors are required to implement BMPs that reduce stormwater pollution.
- City Inspectors ensure contractor compliance with the State's Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan permits.
- Stormwater pollution control concerns should be submitted via written correspondence, phone, email, or the Report a Concern feature on the City's website.

MCM #5: Post-Construction Stormwater Management in New Development and Redevelopment

- The City adopted the MARC/APWA Manual of Best Management Practices for Stormwater Quality.
- Engineering staff reviews development plans prior to issuing building permits.
- Long-term maintenance and inspection responsibility is designated in submittals of new or re-development plats/plans.
- The City maintains an inventory of private stormwater quality facilities.



MCM #6: Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations

- The City provides yearly training to applicable City Staff on preventative measures and emergency spill response.
- An Operations and Maintenance Plan will be developed by the City to prevent stormwater pollution and implement good housekeeping operations at all municipal facilities.
- Training and improved stormwater awareness will help the staff identify and mitigate illicit discharges throughout Belton.
